

- Only currently registered and paid UCD students can be active members; only active members may vote
 money, and represent the group to the University.
- Currently enrolled UCD students must comprise three-fourths of the organization's membership.
- A graduate student organization is a student group, whose primary purpose as identified by the group is interests of UC Davis graduate students.
- The group membership must consist of a minimum of 66% graduate students and at least two of the prim
- Associate members may be students on PELP, UCD staff, faculty, and the immediate families of UCD stuc
 individuals. Associate members may attend group meetings and events, participate in discussions, serve
 perform small tasks for the group.

Then..

1) Attend at least 3 General Meetings per quarter

OR

Be an active member of cowsay

Membership

- 1. Our club consists of members.
- 2. Members must be currently enrolled as a degree-seeking student at the University of California, Davis.
- 3. Members may be undergraduate, graduate, part-time, or full time.
- 4. To remain in good standing, starting the member's first full academic quarter, for each academic quarter, excluding summer, a member must:
 - Be actively enrolled full-time or part-time at UC Davis in an undergraduate, graduate, or doctoral degree program
 - 2. And must meet one of the following requirements within a guarter:
 - 1. Attend at least three Cyber Security Club at UC Davis events
 - 2. Attend at least one Cyber Security Club at UC Davis meeting if and only if there has been no more than three Cyber Security Club at UC Davis meetings that quarter
 - 3. Be a good standing member of cowsay.
- 5. Calculations for good standing are to be made at the end of each academic quarter, excluding summer.



WRCCDC

 Act as a mock IT team, maintain and defend a computer system from live hackers

CPTC

 Conduct a mock security audit on a computer network



What Do We Compete In?

Competitions We're Doing This Year

- Hivestorm
 - Find and fix security vulnerabilities on virtual machines
- Capture-the-Flag (CTF)
 - A category of competitions involving puzzles that require cyber skills to solve
