What is hacking? Two definitions:

Playful solving of technical problems.

Effecting a computer system in a way that is unintentional.

Both terms in a modern sense originated from the same place.

Origination of Hacking

"Phreaking" - Phone Hacking

As phone systems were increasingly automated, people found ways to abuse these systems.

Originated in the 1960s and 1970s, and was common until the early 2010s.

Often freaking was used to get free/discounted calls.

Growth of Networks

In the 1980s and 1990s, computer systems were increasingly connected to phones.


